## Fair Betting Record Set

### More Than 10,000 Watch Aristo-Tex Win Feature

Aristo-Tex, ridden by Jockey Harry Walker, won the Labor day handicap at the State Fairgrounds yesterday as a record crowd watched. Upwards of 10,000 people crammed their way into every available bit of viewing space and poured \$188,336 through the ticket windows, another all-time record.

The Labor day handicap was disputed when Gil Simonis, riding Valentine Joe, claimed that Aristo-Tex had cut in too close on one of the turns. But the judges disallowed the alleged foul.

Aristo-Tex, who had won a race at the Fairgrounds just two days previous, paid \$18.80, 9.00 and 4.00. The horse is owned by L. M. Byrd of Phoenix, Ore.

State fair racing resumes with a 10-race card today, starting with a quarter-horse race at 1:15.

Other race programs are slated to start at 1:15 on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday at the Lone Oak oval.

# Spokane, Lewiston in Battle Down to Wire

## WIL Standings

The Salem Senators and Yakima Bears split a Labor day doubleheader at Yakima, Salem taking the first game 3-1 and Yakima winning the second 3-2.

In the close nightcap, the Bears got off to an early two-run lead in the first inning, added another in the third, and then coasted to victory. The first inning runs came on two errors by Salem Shortstop Gene Tanelli.

In the opening game, Salem first baseman Jerry Ballard slammed out two home runs to lead his team to victory. His fourth inning round-tripper was good for only one run, but the ninth inning homer brought in another runner ahead of him. Tanelli and Les Witherspoon banged out triples for the Senators.

Spokane and Lewiston carried their stride-for-stride race for the Western International Baseball League's second-half pennant down to the wire Monday with sweeps of Labor day doubleheaders.

And whether the Indians or the Broncs meet Salem in the postseason playoff won't be known until after Tuesday night's season-ending encounter.

Spokane clipped Tri-City 13-1 and 11-6 in the Labor day twin bill at Kennewick, while Lewiston thumped Victoria 6-1 and 7-8 at Astoria.

The sweeps left Spokane out in front in the flag chase but Lewiston still had a mathematical chance of overtaking the Indians.

A Spokane victory in Tuesday night's finale would give the Indians a six percentage point edge in the final standings, even if Lewiston downed Victoria. But if Spokane loses and Lewiston wins, the title will go to the Broncs—a margin of seven percentage points.

Tri-City pitchers were generous with the gopher balls as Spokane coasted to its double triumph at Kennewick Monday. The Indians popped out four home runs in the first game and three in the second.

Lewiston had little trouble with Victoria in their seven-inning opener but it took the Broncs 11 innings to subdue the Tyees in the nightcap.

Vancouver and Edmondton, meanwhile, advanced in the standings, taking over third and fourth place respectively.

Vancouver moved in behind Lewiston but four games off the pace, with 4-2 and 5-4 wins over Wenatchee. Edmondton downed Calgary 4-2 in a single game at Calgary.

Willie Ramsdell, who came in to retire the side, went the rest of the distance—but didn't do much better. The Padres plastered him for seven more runs.

The Solons wrecked Seattle in the opener with a four-run outburst in the ninth inning. Five straight one-baggers accounted for the tallies. Marino Pieretti hit one of them to assure his 11th win after he relieved Al Yaxilan in the eighth. Vern Kindfather lost his 16th decision.

The Seals were carried 11 innings before they took the opener 5-4. Then the lid blew as they romped home 7-3 in a wild finale that saw both teams and five fans charge the field in the third inning. The fans got in the act when they protested against a call

by umpire Don Silva at first base after he had tossed George Vico out for punching him in the previous frame. The cops then tossed the fans out, order was finally restored.

Seals Took Both  
The Seals opened an all-out drive for third place by sweeping a twin bill from the Angels, 5-4 and 7-2. The surprise coup halted the fifth place Seals to within two games of the Chubs.

Fourth place Portland, one game behind the Angels, missed a chance to move into a tie with them by splitting a nocturnal twin bill with San Diego. The Padres won the seven-inning opener 15-4 and Portland salvaged the finale, 4-1.

Flores not only humiliated the Twinks in the first game, but drove in three of Oakland's runs to chalk up his eighth win of the year. The Little Flower of Guadalajara smashed a three-run double in the fifth inning.
