Beautiful Jersey Cow Grand Champion at Fair

From at least two important standpoints Chehalis Beacon VI was the right cow to select as grand champion Jersey female at the State Fair yesterday.

A beautiful specimen of Jersey type, she not only won the strong 3-year-old cow class but also took first place in the best uddered cow class.

Owned and shown by Frank Finnicum, Dayton, she was recently purchased by Finnicum from her breeder, Tommy Lister, of Chilliwack, B. C., Canada.

Seven year old Design's Annabell Princess was made reserve champion. Twice a grand champion at prior State Fairs, she was complimented by Judge Walter Leth as still a cow of great constitution and capacity.

D. C. Brock of Salem won the female junior champion award on Designer Radar Ruby, a senior yearling. Radar Golden Blonde, another of the popular strain of Jerseys Brock has developed, was first in the 4-year-old cow class.

The senior and grand champion bull was Jett-A-Wonder Royalist, a 4-year-old bred and shown by M. C. Malar, Boring. He was first as a senior yearling at the State Fair in 1951.

Design Royal of Avalon, shown and bred by Deetz, was junior champion bull. Oregon Jersey queen Mildred Oman, 18, of Sherwood, distributed award ribbons to class winners during the day.

George Genteman, chairman of the Oregon Jersey Cattle Club youth activities committee, made presentations of four heifer calves to youngsters interested in Jersey dairying.

Gordon Stroebel, 16 year old F. F. A. boy of Prineville, received a heifer donated by Herbert Coleman of Woodburn. A calf donated by Floyd E. Bates of Salem went to Gary Turner of Bend, top 4-H Jersey dairyman of the year.

"Rusty," 952 pound Hereford calf fitted by Frances Deardorff of Prairie City, looked very sharp as he walked off with the 4-H fat steer championship. He recently passed his 16 month birthday, has been on feed for 300 days, during which time he has gained 2.3 pounds per day munching a grain ration of corn and oats.

Irvin Riddell of Monmouth, son of Mr. and Mrs. Eldon Riddell, exhibited the reserve champion steer, a thick, short-legged Angus.

Malheur County Judge Passes

Ontario, Ore. (AP)—Sewell Stanton, Malheur county judge and a strong advocate of public power, died at his home there Tuesday night. He was 59.

He was elected county judge, his first political office in 1950 after he had retired as an oil distributor here. He was born at Colusa, Calif., in 1894 and attended college in California before coming to Oregon.

He was a republican but supported public power programs and was one of the organizers of the National Hells Canyon association, a group

which urges construction of a high, multipurpose dam at Hells Canyon.

The widow and two daughters, all of Ontario, survive. Gov. Paul Patterson will name Stanton's successor.
