Charles Ernest Roblin, 83, who resided at 787 Center street for the past half century, died here Labor day.

Roblin had been for 36 years chief of the records section of the Land Division of the Interior department. He retired from that post 12 years ago.

Roblin, who graduated in law from Willamette university in 1893 was the second man to ever climb Mt. Jefferson. He accomplished this feat in 1897. He was appointed as a special agent to allot land to Indians in 1910 by President Tatt.

Robin was born in Winnipeg. Manitoba on January 16, 1870. He moved to Oregon in 1888. Masonic Lodge 4, both of Salem, and the Afifi Temple in Tacoma, Wash.
