Oregon U Football Fans Happiest in Five Years

This is the first in a series of articles dealing with the 1953 prospects of West Coast college football teams. Eugene, Ore. (AP) — Quarterback George Shaw, one-plate football and the third year of a rebuilding program under Coach Len Casanova had Oregon pigskin followers more hopeful today than they've been since 1948.

Casanova has 24 returning lettermen, some of whom already have played both offense and defense because of manpower shortages. There are also a dozen promising sophomores and a sprinkling of transfers.

And there's Shaw. The six-foot, one-inch, 178-pound junior is the key man in any Oregon hopes for a football renaissance. He has played both ways for two years and does everything well. As a freshman in 1951 he intercepted 13 passes, an NCAA record. As a sophomore last year, he completed 23 passes against California for a PCC mark.

Sophomore Dick James and transfer Walt Gaffney are expected to give the lettermen a run for their money for starting left and right halfback spots. Left half Ted Anderson, right half Farrell Albright and fullbacks Cece Hodges and Dean Van Leuven are due for heavy service.

Casanova believes his team will be stronger "and our opponents will know they've been in a battle." Oregon, since winning nine and losing two in 1948 when it went to the Cotton Bowl, has won only nine while losing 30 in four years.

Before the secret session, backfieldmen practiced punting and place-kicking. It appeared that quarterbacks George Shaw and Barney Holland would alternate in the kicking assignments when the season opens Sept. 19.

Eggert's Homer in 12th Gives Portland 2-1 Win

San Diego (AP) — Don Eggert, walloped his 15th homerun of the year last night in the 12th inning to give Portland a 2 to 1 victory over the San Diego Padres before 1,593 PCL fans. Royce Lint picked up his 20th win, while Willie Luna was nicked for his 11th loss.

The game was tied 0-0 at the end of the ninth. In the 11th, Portland got a run when Jim Russell was safe at first on Catcher Red Mathias' error and Herm Reich and Granville Gladstone singled. Earl Rapp tied the game again in the bottom of the 11th with his 21st homer of the season.

The win put Portland four games up on the Padres in the battle for fourth place in the PCL. In a twin bill tonight, Cliff Fanning (13-12) and Lloyd Dickey (7-7) go for the Padres against Glenn Elliott (11-13) and Fred Sanford (7-11).

Corvallis (AP) — Two big building jobs were under way on the Oregon State college campus today, a new football stadium and a football team to play in it.

The stadium is scheduled to be ready for the homecoming game against Washington State November 15. When the football team will be ready is anyone's guess.

As Coach Kip Taylor puts it: "It will still be tough." This season 20 lettermen are gone, among them fullback Sam Baker, the greatest ground gainer in the school's history. Of the 18 lettermen returning, only four are two strikers. Could Be Good  
The line looks strong in the middle and weak elsewhere. The backfield appears fair and could be good.

Captain Laverne Ferguson one of the previous two year lettermen, and Bill Johnson, whom Taylor thinks will be one of his best, hold down the guard slots. At center is Joe Fulwyler, a 60-minute man of the team last season. At tackle, Taylor is counting on two reserves from last year: Jim Luster and Ron Aeschbacher. Wes Ediger is

the only letterman back at Backfield Veterans  
Taylor figures on two-year letterman Jack Pinion, an explosive type runner, at fullback.
