Allan A. Smith, attorney for the Pacific Power and Light company, reviewed what he termed the political background of the case and declared that various moves made by Sweetland were designed to gain publicity and keep the surcharge issue alive, "Sweetland failed to take the stand himself and he produced no witnesses to support his charges," Smith declared. "There is nothing in the record to show that any of the companies had excessive earnings available to offset the added.
