

NY Can Clinch Pennant Today by Win Over Tribe

Monday is V-day for Manager Casey Stengel and his New York Yankees.

Y stands for five, the record number of consecutive pennants Stengel and the Yankees are certain of winning, a feat never accomplished before by club or manager.

The world champions reduced their "magic number" to two Sunday by defeating the Cleveland Indians 6-3 on the amazing Johnny Mize's pinch hit home run with two mates aboard in the eighth inning.

Two is the combination number of Yankee victories and-or Indian defeats needed to gain New York's fifth straight pennant. As the Yankees and Indians were to clash again Monday afternoon, a New York victory would eliminate the Tribe from any mathematical possibility of overtaking the Yankees.

Incidentally, for the department of file-and-forget, the Chicago White Sox officially faded out of the pennant race Sunday losing 7-6 to the Red Sox of Boston.

In other American League games, Detroit solidified its hold on sixth place, sweeping both ends of a doubleheader from Washington 10-4 and 6-4 while the St. Louis Browns and Philadelphia Athletics divided their doubleheader.

Chicago's seventh place Cubs extended their winning streak to nine straight, defeating the National League champion Brooklyn Dodgers 3-2 in 10 innings. The St. Louis Cardinals rolled up 19 hits crushing the Philadelphia Phillies 17-3 for Harvey Haddix' 18th triumph.

Warren Spahn won his 20th as Milwaukee split a doubleheader with the New York Giants. Joe Adcock's 18th homer with a man on base enabled Spahn to win a 2-1 hurling duel from Larry Jansen in the opener.

After Pittsburgh's Paul LePage pitched a seven-hit 5-4 triumph in the opener, Cincinnati came back to win the second game 8-6 and hand the Pirates' Murray Dickson his 19th defeat.

Old John Mize was the Yankee hero. The 40-year-old pinch hitter de luxe strode out of the dugout with runners on first and second, one out in the eighth, the score tied at 3-3 and whacked Mike Garcia's first pitch into the right field stands for a three-run homer.

Garcia and the Indians had a 2-2 lead going into the last half of the eighth. Two mighty homers by Larry Doby and Al Rosen's run-scoring single had put the Yankees' Vic Raschi behind.

News Guild Out, Portland, Me.

Portland, Maine 4P.—A strike of CIO employees of the Guy Gannett Publishing Co. curtailed production of Monday's Portland Press Herald from a normal four editions to one and was expected to involve the evening's Express.

About 100 workers in the editorial, maintenance, proof reading and mailing departments did not report Sunday night in a dispute stemming from a deadlock in contract negotiations between the company and Local 128, American Newspaper Guild.

The Guild said in a statement that employees of the Press Herald, Evening Express and Sunday Telegram now generally are paid \$15 to \$40 a week below a national wage average for their classifications in the newspaper industry and that management offered a raise of \$1 to \$3 that would affect only two-thirds of the local membership.

General Manager Laurence H. Stubbs said wage scales paid to guildsmen are the industry's highest in Maine. He said raises up to \$8.25 a week were offered in recent negotiations.

Current wage scales were not disclosed.
