Diesel Engine Falls 150 Feet

Oroville, Calif. (AP)—The Western Pacific's swift streamliner California Zephyr piled into a huge rock slide in the Feather River Canyon late Tuesday, and the lead diesel locomotive unit plunged 150 feet down the canyon.

A WP spokesman said none of the 165 passengers was injured, and that engineer R. E. Luzzadder and fireman M. W. Snow, in the cab of the locomotive were only shaken up.

Heavy rains were blamed for the 300-ton slide.

The train, en route from San Francisco to Chicago, was derailed over Southern Pacific tracks to Winnemucca, Nev., and will reach Chicago about 10 hours late.

Record Made in Loans to Veterans

Oregon veterans of World War II and of the Korean War borrowed a record \$682,300 from the state veterans department during October to buy farms and homes.

Since the program started in 1945, the department has loaned \$46 million, and \$15,500,567 already has been repaid.

Pilot Says Someone Took Gas From Tank

Fairfield, Calif. (AP)—The owner of a twin-engine plane which ran out of gas and made a forced landing near here Tuesday says "someone drained 50 gallon tank" either at The Dalles, Ore., or Oroville, Calif.

William J. Smith of Kentfield, Calif., said he will ask the Civil Aeronautics Board to investigate.

Smith and two friends escaped injury in the sheep pasture landing.

5 Former Prisoners Have Checks Coming

Five Oregon World War II veterans, who have checks coming to them because they were prisoners of war, are being sought by federal and state veterans officials.

The officials would like to find them to hand them their checks, which might run as high as \$2,000.

The men, and their last known addresses, are: Charles Murray Roberts, general delivery, Coos Bay; Albert Leo Willis, Box 175, Umatilla; Walter Amundson, 1412 Pearl Street, Eugene; Wallace Glenn Taylor, 745 N. Russell Street,

Portland, and Robert Grimes Carlton, 104 SE Grand, Portland.

The money is paid by the federal War Claims Commission.

These prisoners of war payments have been given to 1,680 Oregon veterans and total \$993,400.
