Marshal Faces Theft Charges

Goldendale, Wash. (AP) — Grand larceny charges were filed Tuesday against Goldendale night marshal Dean Bay in connection with a liquor store safe robbery and thefts from three business establishments here.

Sheriff E. C. Kaiser said Bay, named night marshal here five months ago, confessed to the \$1,500 liquor store robbery Sept. 5 and admitted thefts from a garage, service station and hardware store.

Kaiser said almost "enough loot for a hardware store" was found in Bay's apartment after his arrest.

The sheriff said Bay was taken into custody after four wheels which had been stolen from a garage here were found on his automobile.

He was charged with four counts of grand larceny in information filed with the county clerk by Prosecutor Thurman Ward.

Bay, 25, is married and the father of two children. He formerly lived at LaGrande, Ore.

Bible Talks at Salem Church

A Bible conference will be held at the First Presbyterian church November 22 through 27 with Dr. John Wick Bowman, professor of new testament interpretation, San Francisco Theological Seminary, San Anselmo, Calif., giving two lectures each day.

Dr. Bowman will speak on "The Book of Revelation" at 10 o'clock each morning, except Thanksgiving day, Thursday, when the conference will be at 11 o'clock. His evening messages will be on "The Word of God and Conversion" each evening at 7:30 except Thursday. The conference begins Sunday evening.

Before coming to San Francisco Seminary, Dr. Bowman had taught in Union Theological College at Saharanpur, North India in Western Theological Seminary, Pittsburgh, Penna., and St. Mary's College of the University of St. Andrews, Scotland. Dr. Bowman has taught and still teaches in three languages Greek, Hindustani, and English. His new testament courses, in the Seminary include historical and literary matters, interpretation and Exegesis, and Biblical theology. He was editor's consultant on the Revised Standard Version of the Bible and was one of the editors of the Westminster Study edition of the Bible. Dr. Bowman has published a number of books, the latest being "The Religion of Maturity."

These Bible messages are open to the public.

Lebanon Sponsors Xmas Decorations

New York (AP)—Electric energy distributed in the United States last week rose to 8,457,342,000 kilowatt-hours from 8,397,523,000 the week before Edison Electric Institute reported Wednesday.

Last week's figure was 7.3 per cent higher than the 7,883,878,000 kilowatt-hours distributed in the same week of 1952.

All sections of the country showed gains including the Pacific Northwest up 21.9 per cent.
