

American Can Strike Voted

Portland (AP) — Employees have voted to authorize a strike against the American Can Co. plant here, officials of the CIO Steelworkers Union reported Tuesday.

The vote gave Jack Heathman, union president, authority

to call a strike against the plant which employs about 500.

The union and the company have been negotiating in New York on a new work contract for some time. The union has asked wage increases and other benefits. The negotiations affect 20,000 throughout the country.
