Suspected Meningitis Now Said to Be Polio

An illness which was diagnosed early in the month as meningitis has been changed to poliomyelitis, according to a recent release of communicable and reportable diseases issued by the Marion county department of health.

The upswing in the number of instances of measles continued through the week ending November 21 when 11 cases were reported. In addition, there were 8 instances of German measles.

Other cases of disease listed included: 1 each of hepatitis, impetigo, meningitis and lobar pneumonia.

Sixty-seven physicians, or 58 per cent of those in the county, reported to the health department.
