APRICOT GLAZED PORK BUTT

Ingredients: One 2½-pound (about) boned smoked pork shoulder butt, ¼ cup apricot preserves, 2 tablespoons orange juice.

Method: Cook pork butt according to directions on cellophane wrapper. Mix together apricot preserves and orange juice. Place pork butt in shallow baking pan; spread with apricot mixture; bake in slow (325F) oven 20 to 30 minutes, basting several times. Serve with a little of the glaze over each slice. Makes 6 servings.


