Today's Menu

Here's a way to serve fish that's just a little different.

FAMILY SUPPER
Scalloped Tomatoes and Corn
Salad Rolls
Cookies Beverage
Fish Puffs

Ingredients: 1 pound flounder or ocean perch filets, 1/2 cup milk, 1 tablespoon butter or margarine, 1 cup mashed potatoes, 3 eggs (separated), salt and pepper to taste, 1 tablespoon finely grated onion, paprika.

Method: Cook filets in small amount of boiling salted water, covering and simmering just until fish is opaque and flakes easily. Discard any skin and flake fish; there should be 2 cups. Heat milk and butter; add to potatoes with egg yolks; beat well. Stir in salt and pepper, fish, and onion. Beat egg whites until stiff and fold in. Turn into greased individual baking dishes. Place in pan of hot water and bake in moderate (350F) oven about 30 minutes or until browned. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

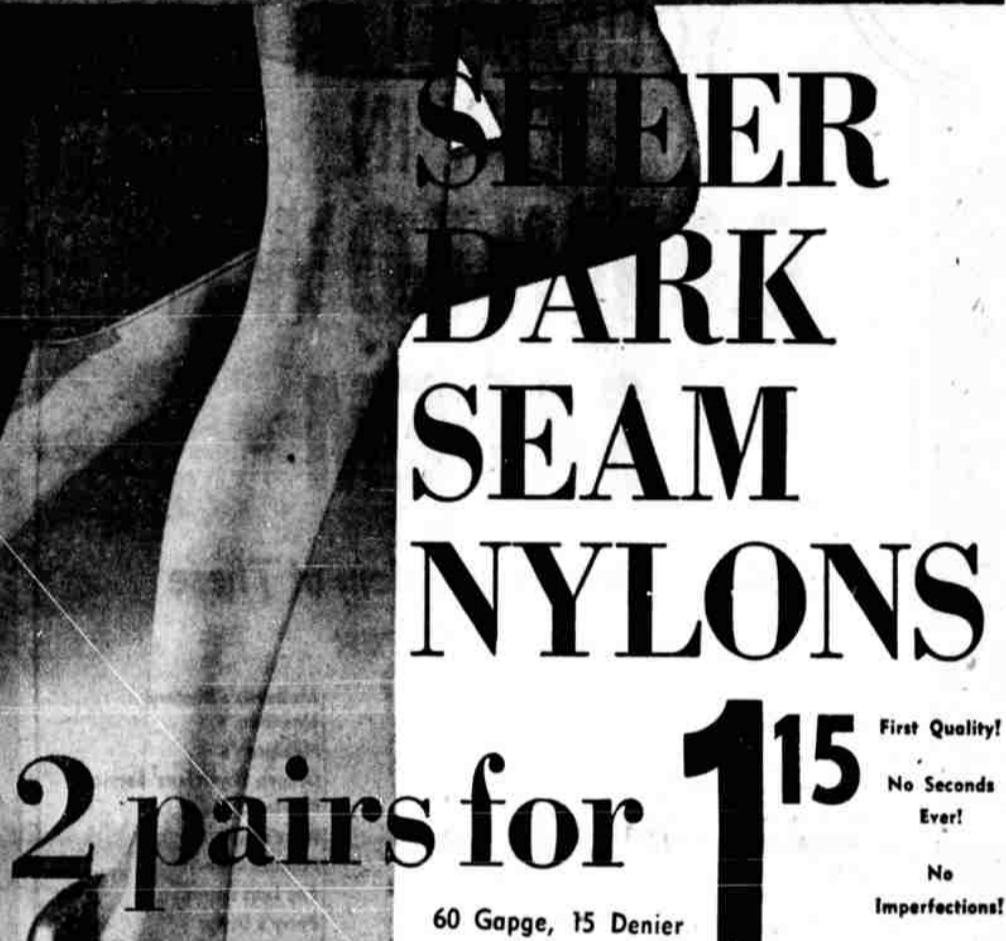
