

### Hawaii's Economy Outpaces U.S. Total

Washington (AP) — The department of commerce reports that from 1939 to 1952, Hawaii's economy outpaced the nation's slightly.

The report, first to be made on the Hawaiian economy, said total production of goods and services in Hawaii expanded from 270 million dollars in 1939 to \$2,050,000,000 in 1952. During the same period U. S. total production went from \$91,300,000,000 to 348 billions.

### Government Spent \$11 Billion in 60 Days

Washington (AP) — The senate-house committee on reduction of non-essential federal expenditures says the government spent 11 billion dollars in the first two months of the fiscal year which started July 1.

The government had about 150 1/2 billions of spending authority left for the remaining 10 months, said the report issued yesterday by the group's chairman, Sen. Byrd (D., Va.).

Alexandria, La. (AP) — Mary Weems, 81, didn't scream when a man awakened her yesterday by removing the screen from her bedroom window.

### Woodburn After Jr. First Citizen

Woodburn — The nomination of a candidate for Woodburn's 1953 junior first citizen started this week in the annual contest sponsored by the local junior chamber of commerce and nominations will be received up until the deadline Tuesday night, December 15. The honor last year went to Lyman Seely, manager of the Woodburn branch of the First National bank of Portland.

To be eligible for selection as Woodburn's first citizen for 1953 the candidate must be between the ages of 21 and 36. He need not be a Jaycee member.

Nominations may be made by churches, fraternal organizations and service clubs and by individuals. More than one nomination may be made by any group or individual. The necessary blanks may be obtained from any Jaycee member, at the Woodburn Independent office or the blank printed in the local paper may be used.

The three judges, business and professional men of the city, will decide the winner from the names submitted on the basis of service to the community, state and nation, individual achievements, leadership and service and personal character and ability.

The award will consist of a distinguished service key and certificate to be presented at a banquet honoring the junior first citizen January 19. The Woodburn winner also will be entered in state and national first citizen competitions. This is a national project of the Jaycees and its second year in Woodburn.

Included in the local committee for the contest are Phil Branson, chairman; Charles Cornwell, Paul Dickenson, Wilbur Green, Karl Wojohn, Keith Olson, Dr. Lucus Sprinker, Walter Scarborough, Jr., and E. A. Buchanan.

Nominating blanks are to be mailed to the Distinguished Service Award committee in care of the Woodburn Independent before midnight Dec. 15 and the winner will be announced Jan. 7, 1954.
