Postmen Walk
Nets Over \$900
Salem mail carriers who rewalked their routes Friday night in the interest of the financial campaign of the Muscular Dystrophy Association of America, received contributions of \$900, according to estimates of Richard S. McKee, general chairman for the local effort.

The 40 carriers who donated their time early Friday night reported \$855.58 had been given by householders living along their routes. However, it is believed this sum will be augmented considerably.

No stops were made at homes where the porch lights were not burning. In many instances, it is presumed prospective donors forgot to switch on their lights.

McKee expressed his pleasure over the response of the public. He said the original collection had been augmented early Saturday morning by an additional \$55.

Persons who were not at home when the carriers made their tour or others who wish to contribute to the fund, may do so by mailing their donations in an envelope addressed to Muscular Dystrophy Association of America, Inc., care of postmaster, Salem, Ore. No stamp is necessary.

The association hoped to raise \$5,000,000 on a nationwide basis. The money would be used in connection with a program of research looking toward a cure for the crippling and fatal disease.
