**Cornmeal Waffles**  
Ingredients: 1 1/4 cups sifted flour, 3/4 cup cornmeal, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 egg (well beaten), 1 1/2 cups milk, 8 tablespoons butter or margarine (melted).

Method: Sift together flour, cornmeal, baking powder, salt and sugar into mixing bowl. Combine egg, milk and butter; add to dry ingredients and mix until smooth. Bake on waffle iron, following the manufacturer's directions.
