 The Bulletin reports that the Board of Governors has called a meeting in Portland on December 17 when committee chairmen will be invited to meet with the board when the year's program of the state bar will be outlined and determination made of the work each committee will undertake during the 12 months. It is expected the invitation to Benson to accept the position will be made at this meeting.
