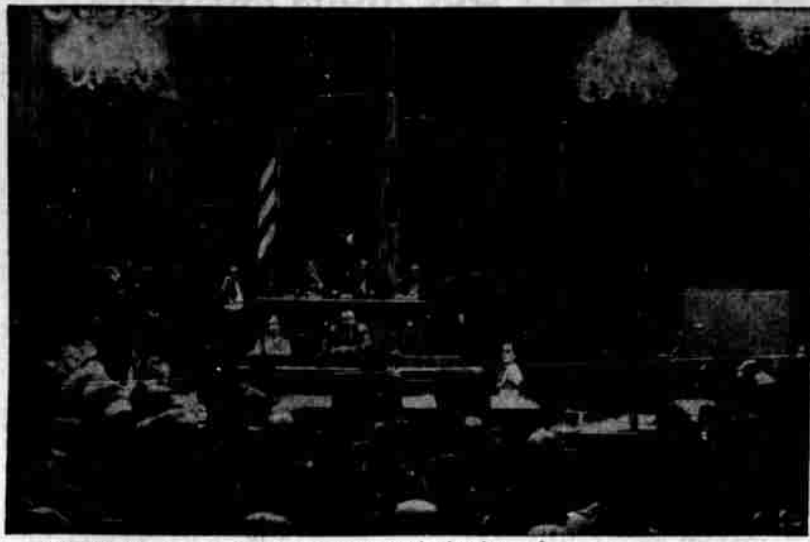


HOUSE UNAMERICAN ACTIVITIES HEARING

Lacomb Lumber Deal Confirmed

Albany — Acquisition of an interest in the Western Veneer plant at Griggs station, near Lacomb, by the Willamette Valley Lumber company was made known here by William Swindells, president of the lumber manufacturing concern. The telephoned announcement coincided with the filing of articles of incorporation here Monday by Robert S. Miller, Ralph H. King and Maurice O. Georges, members of a Portland legal firm, acting in behalf of the Western Veneer & Plywood Co., with headquarters given at Lacomb, near where the plant is situated.

Capitalization of the new corporation is recorded as \$1,000,000, but Swindells said this is not in excess of the present value of the Western Veneer Co. plant and that incorporation does not indicate immediate plans for expansion.

"We do not plan to make any changes whatsoever," Swindells said. "The Willamette Valley Lumber Co., is merely acquiring an interest in the operation, which will continue to function as before."

Harold Jones, Eugene, is president of the Western Veneer company and will continue Veneer & Plywood Co., it was indicated by Swindells.

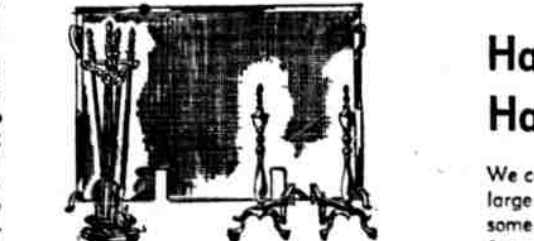

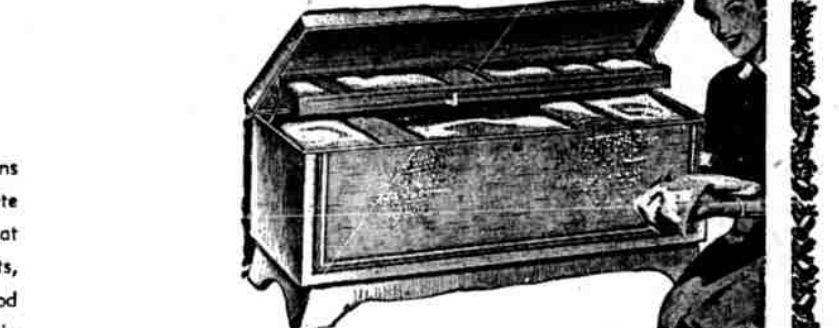
