C. of I.'s Hayes Picked To AP Little All-America

(AP)—The Associated Press' Little All-American football team of 1953 honors players from colleges in 10 different states, giving recognition to athletes who helped their teams win conference or regional championships, aided in winning bowl bids and, in one case, set national records.

It is doubtful if ever in the past the colleges termed minor by the National Collegiate Athletic Service Bureau, in contrast to the huge brain factories, have been represented by such a stalwart, able team.

Team of Jonesboro again is in a bowl game. To make things easy for this talented array of ball carriers are seven linemen who are stars in their own right.

For the past several years St. Olaf College of Minnesota has been the scourge of its class. This year it whipped eight opponents in succession and registered 361 points to 58.
