

Vikings to Start Five Seniors Friday

Tallest Is 6 Feet 1 For Salem

Five seniors make up the probable Salem starting lineup for Friday night's game with the Roosevelt Roughriders at Salem High Coach Harold Hauk's club opens the season with a lack of height with the tallest starter at 6-1, Wayne Erickson.

Besides Erickson at center the Vikings will use Jim Knapp and Gordy Domogalla at the guards and Larry Springer and Tom Pickens as forwards. The starting five is fast, with Domogalla and Knapp leading the rapid break the team will use during the season.

Four Are Lettermen
Pickens and Springer both lack height as they fall under the six foot mark. Both are lettermen with Springer a two year man. Domogalla and Knapp are also lettermen from last year's team.

This year lack of height apparently is the part that hurts the Vikings most with the loss of Bob Miller, Jack Bishop, and Dave Johnson of last year's squad. Bishop and Johnson were both starters along with Domogalla, Knapp, and Pickens. Knapp was the second highest scorer on the squad.

Behind the five starters Salem has Bob Wolf, 6-4 center playing the middle position, Gary Paterson and Phil Burkland at the forwards, and Herb Triplett and Neal Scheidel at the guard posts. Both Wolf and Burkland are fine backboard men while the entire second string also has speed with Scheidel one of the fastest on the team.

Wednesday the Vikings had a hard scrimmage but taper off tomorrow with a light scrimmage. Salem is starting a rugged schedule which sees them meet such strong teams as Hillsboro, Marshfield, Grants Pass, Eugene, Corvallis and Albany.

Although they are expected to have an unimpressive year the team is still going to be hard to beat. Roosevelt, always a strong team in the Portland league, dropped the Vikings to open Salem's season last year but the Vikes came back to run away from the roughriders.

The game Friday night starts at 8:15 in the high school gymnasium.

All Starters Back
Last year Roosevelt tied for second with Benson and Jefferson in the Portland league with a 10-5 record, then beat Jeff a playoff to go to the state tournament where Roosevelt lost the first two games.

The Teddies are one of the favorites for the city title this year along with Grant.

Their leaders are Wanaka, all-city forward at 6-foot-3, Wittala, all-city second team as a 5-10 guard and forward. Roosevelt has eight lettermen back, including all five of last year's lettermen.
