Roosevelt to Launch Viking Hoop Schedule

The Salem high Vikings open their schedule tonight when they tangle with the Roosevelt Roughriders at Salem high. The 5:15 clash starts Harold Hauk's Vikings off on a rough schedule including 10 Big Six games. This nonleague go is the first of two games between the two schools this year.

Hauk will stick with five seniors for his starting lineup, including three starters from last year's team. Jim Knapp and Gordy Domogalla, two of the best guards in the state, will lead the Viking fast break which will attempt to make up for the lack of experienced height.

Six-foot-2-inch Wayne Erickson probably will start at center for the Vikings while Tom Pickens and Larry Springer will begin at forwards. Pickens is also a veteran starter from last year while Springer is the only two-year letterman on this year's squad. Traditionally Tough Fee

The Roughriders, a traditional first game foe for the Vikings, topped Salem in the first game last year, but the Vikings came back to even the score with a lopsided win later in the season. Again this year the other game of the series will be played in Portland. Knapp, one of the leading scorers last season, is the fastest starter. Pickens, a fine hustler, Domogalla, Erickson, and Springer are all fast. Roosevelt has always been a strong contender for the Portland league crown while the Vikings have compiled the best record in the Big Six.

Bob Wulf, 6-4 junior center, leads the second string with Gary Paterson and Phil Burkland at the forwards and Neal Scheidel and Herb Triplett at the guards. Triplett is a letterman but had to take back seat to Domogalla and Knapp last year. Scheidel has good speed while Burkland and Paterson are both capable forwards.

The preliminary contest matches the Roosevelt Junior Varsity and Lee Gustafson's Salem high junior varsity.

Lattner and Giel Only Repeaters On 1953 A. P. All-American Team

A. P. All-American Teams

New York (AP)—Notre Dame's John Lattner and Minnesota's Paul Giel, a pair of halfbacks who proved as outstanding in one platoon football as in the two-platoon era, are the only repeaters on the 1953 Associated Press All America team announced today.

Paul Cameron of UCLA and David Kossé Johnson of Rice join the two Westerners to form the first team backfield.

Recommendations by regional boards of newspaper and radio experts covering the entire nation formed the basis for the selections.

The line is composed of Capt. Don Dohoney of Michigan State and Sam Morley of Stanford at ends, Stanley Jones of Maryland and Jack Shanafelt of Penn at tackles, J. D. Roberts of Oklahoma and Crawford Mims of Mississippi at guards and Larry Morris of Georgia Tech at center.

The return of limited substitutions, which also brought back the naming of a single first team rather than a 22-man unit by the Associated Press, put added emphasis on the capable all-around players.

"Bread and Butter Player" Lattner, who played both ways even in the days of specialists, was the bread and butter performer for the Irish. A tireless worker and team inspirational leader, he was a driving runner, excellent tackler and a good punter. After he had ripped through the huge Southern California line for four touchdowns Coach Frank Leahy called him "a wonderful competitor" and a "fine clutch player."

"The finest I ever have ever coached," says Minnesota's Wes Fesler of Giel. Against Michigan he ran for 112 yards and two touchdowns, completed 13 of 18 passes for 169 yards and another score, came up with two leaping interceptions and some important tackles. His three-year total of handling the ball 1,056 times was a national record. He ran and passed for 1,339 yards this year.

Sanders Praises Cameron Cameron, UCLA's workhorse at tailback in the Bruin single wing, rushed for 672 yards and scored 72 points to lead the Pacific Coast Conference in both departments. He also added 326 yards by passing. His coach, Red Sanders, said, "O' don't think we would have reached the Rose Bowl without this all-around player."

The lightest man on the team at 178 pounds, Johnson combined speed and power at fullback for Rice. His 944 net rushing yardage was second highest in Southwest Conference history. He also rated tops as a punter, linebacker and blocker.

The All America line, which averages 203.5 pounds per man, is flanked on one side by Dohoney, a 193-pounder who excels on defense. He personally

Morley, who caught 43 passes for 894 yards and six touchdowns, was exceptional in his first year of playing defense.

One Junior in Line Georgia Tech's Morris, the only junior to go with the otherwise all-senior lineup, was the best line-backer and blocker for the Engineers.

Mims, who stood out in every game, and Roberts, the kingpin of one of the finest lines in the nation, were excellent 200-pound guards. Mims rushed opposing passers and kickers constantly, blocking three punts in two games. Roberts, a defense specialist in '52, was unsurpassed on offense.

Jones, top-weighted man on the squad at 235, was the bulwark of a defense that held Maryland's opponents to a mere 31 points. Shanafelt was the principal reason Penn made as good a showing as it did on its "suicide" schedule.
