Israel to Continue Ben-Gurion Policies
Jerusalem (AP)—Israel's parliament voted overwhelmingly Monday night to continue the foreign policy the Jewish nation followed before Premier David Ben-Gurion's resignation.

By a 58-22 vote, the lawmakers endorsed a foreign policy statement blasting the recent U.N. Security Council

Hop Crop Down 11 Million Lbs.

The world's 1953 hop crop is down about 11,000,000 pounds as compared with that of 1952, according to estimates of the U. S. department of agriculture's foreign agricultural service.

The world yield for 1953 is placed at 132 million pounds, of which the United States is credited with 41,752,000. A year ago this country produced 52,239,000 pounds.

The reduction is due mainly to the smaller crops harvested in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom and Japan. A substantially lower crop is indicated also for Australia.

On the other hand larger crops than a year ago are reported for Germany, Czechoslovakia, Belgium, France,
