## Today's Menu

Here's a new way to use hamburger in a casserole dish.

Beef and Noodle Casserole

**Beef and Noodle Casserole**  
Ingredients: 1 tablespoon salt, 2 quarts boiling water, 8 ounces (about 4 cups) medium egg noodles, 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, 1/2 cup chopped onion, 1 pound ground chuck beef, 2 tablespoons chili sauce, 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1 tablespoon soy sauce, 1 teaspoon garlic salt, 1 cup soft bread crumbs, 1 cup milk (scalded), 1 egg (well beaten), 1/4 cup grated cheddar cheese.

Method: Add 1 tablespoon salt to rapidly boiling water. Gradually add noodles so water continues to boil. Cook uncovered, stirring occasionally, until tender. Drain in colander. Melt butter in skillet; add onion and beef; stir and cook until beef is browned. Add chili sauce, Worcestershire, soy sauce, garlic salt and bread crumbs; mix well. Add milk and egg; mix lightly but thoroughly. Turn into greased 1 1/2-quart casserole and sprinkle with cheese. Bake in moderate (350 degree) oven 30 minutes. Makes 6 servings.
