Jurors Cancel Fee For Employment

Albany — Sigurd Holland was relieved by a district court jury of the obligation to pay \$154 which an employment agency said he still owed in return for receiving a job at Fairbanks, Alaska, in March, 1951.

The jury found in favor of the defendant and against W. T. Grier, doing business as Valley Credit Service, into whose

hand the account had been placed by the National Personnel Service.

The plaintiff claimed Holland had contracted to pay \$300 for the agency's service, but paid only \$146. Holland's defense was that he did not work long enough to justify paying the full fee.
