Chandler Pays Tribute to Department Personnel

Just before the December meeting of the Oregon State Highway commission ended Friday, Ben Chandler, chairman, announced that he had a statement to make. "My grandfather told me that it was a wise policy to pat a man on the back," said Chandler, "and in line with that policy I want to express the satisfaction and appreciation members of this commission feel for the excellent work done by the State Highway Department during the past year."

"We have carried on the largest road construction program, aggregating some \$45 million, during the year, and the success of the huge program is directly due to the diligent and intelligent work of the personnel of the department from top to bottom."

The highway commission chairman also praised the newspapers of the state for support of the highway program, saying that this support has been extremely valuable in keeping the people of the state informed on the progress of the highway program.

Chandler then cited each highway department staff member present at the meeting, naming them and commenting on the work performed by each. Those cited included R. H. Baldock, state highway engineer; W. C. (Dutch) Williams, assistant highway engineer, in charge of construction; William Stiffler, assistant engineer in charge of maintenance; H. B. Glaisyer, secretary; Floyd Query, assistant secretary; Clifford H. Malson, chief accountant; Carl Jordan, director, Travel and Information Bureau; Chester H. Armstrong, superintendent of parks; C. W. Enfield, chief counsel; R. L. Porter, engineer in charge of rights of way; John Cantrall, engineer co-ordinator between highway department and county courts and city councils; Johanna McCaffrey, stenographer, and Monica Duda, receptionist.

Baldock responded in behalf of the highway department, saying that the work of the department had been facilitated because "the members of this commission are better informed on all activities of the department than any other commission in my years with the department."
