Indianapolis (AP) — A baby born Saturday with two heads and four arms, remained in an oxygen tank Monday at Riley hospital at the Indiana university medical center. Doctors said the baby, possibly the only such child ever born alive, remained in critical condition, though there has been some very slight improvement. The baby was born by caesarian section in Washington, Ind., to a 28-year-old mother of three normal daughters.

Portland, (AP) — Mrs. Dorothy McCullough Lee, former Portland mayor who now is a member of the federal board of paroles, left Sunday for McNeil Island federal prison on Puget Sound after a brief stop here. She will hear the cases of some 200 convicts up for parole. Mrs. Lee said she and her husband plan to keep their legal residence in Portland although they are trying to sell their present house here.

Police Sell Bicycles at \$15 Average

Twelve bicycles brought an average price of slightly over \$15 for the city Saturday at the semiannual auction of lost and abandoned bikes at the city shops at 22nd and Howard streets. The money goes into the city general fund. Police Chief Clyde Warren acted as auctioneer and garnered prices ranging from \$3 to \$27 from among the large number of bidders. He was assisted by City

Juvenile Officer Kenneth Seipp. The number of bikes scheduled for sale was cut down from 18 to 12 when owners showed up prior to sale time and claimed bikes which had been lost, stolen or abandoned several months ago. Some of the 12 purchased were destined to be Christmas presents, the buyers indicated. There are still a number of bicycles held by police that they would like to see the owners claim. They are bikes that have been turned into the station in the past six months. The owners may have them by giving the serial numbers or otherwise identifying them, Seipp said.

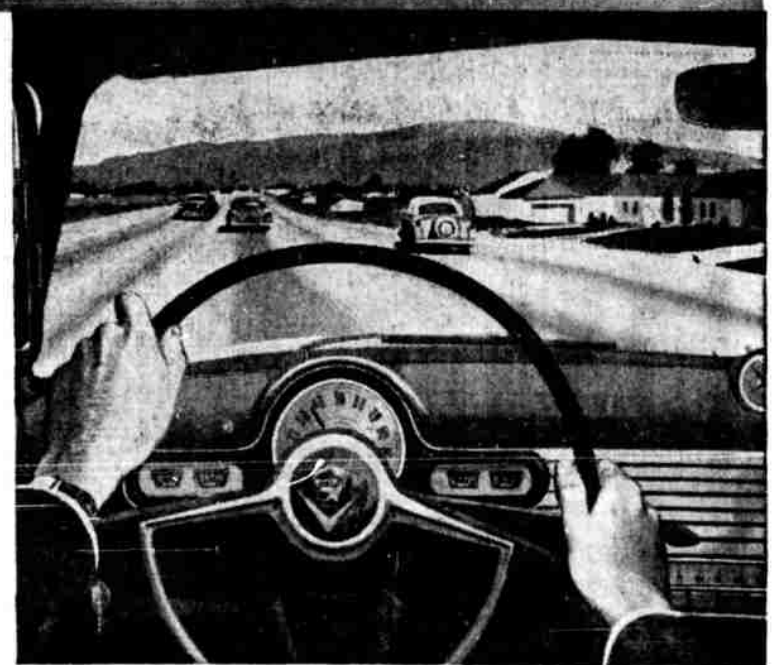
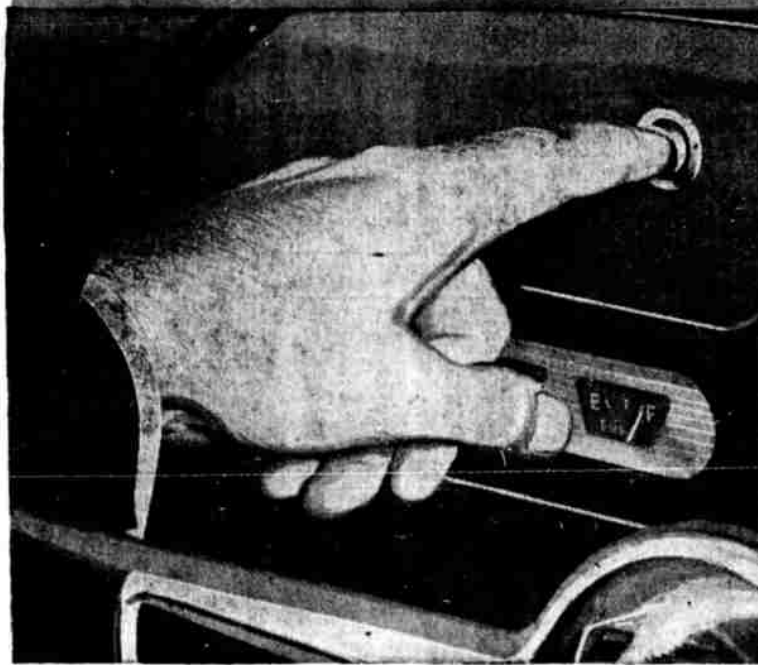
