## Raver for Rocky Beach Dam on Columbia River

Walla Walla (AP)—A recent proposal for construction of Rocky Beach Dam on the Columbia River by the Chelan County Public Utility District may not be the final answer to the "partnership" concept of river development, but it is worth serious consideration as a workable formula, the retiring Bonneville power administrator said here Tuesday night.  
Dr. Paul J. Raver, who is slated to leave the Bonneville Power Administration after the first of the year to become head of Seattle's municipally owned City Light system, told a Walla Walla County Farm Bureau meeting the plan "seems feasible so long as the project under consideration is part of the comprehensive plan for basin development."  
"It is imperative that the partnership idea should not be used as a tool for dismembering the comprehensive plan, as some people apparently would like to do," he said.  
"We must remember that the region will face tremendous economic loss if its power is developed."
