**Omelet With Cheese-Bacon Sauce**

Ingredients: For sauce — 1/4 cup nonfat dry milk powder, 3 tablespoons flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 1/2 cups water, 1/4 pound grated process Swiss cheese, 6 slices chopped cooked bacon. For Omelet — 1/2 cup water, 4 eggs (beaten), 4 tablespoons nonfat dry milk powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 2 tablespoons butter.

Method: To Make Sauce — Sprinkle nonfat dry milk powder, flour and salt over surface of water in top of double boiler. Beat until blended. Cook over hot water, stirring constantly, until sauce begins to thicken. Add cheese and bacon; stir until cheese is melted. To Make Omelet — Add water to eggs; sprinkle nonfat dry milk powder, salt and pepper over surface. Beat until blended. Melt butter in 10-inch skillet. Pour mixture into skillet and cook over medium heat until firm, about 6 minutes. Fold omelet in half. Serve at once with Cheese-Bacon Sauce. Makes 4 servings.
