

Oil Found in Peace River

San Francisco (AP) — The San Francisco office of Viceroy Oil and Explorations Ltd. has reported an oil and gas discovery of great size in British Columbia.

The well, completed by Texaco in the northern part of the area is 60 miles north of the famous St. John fields. Wet gas and light oil spurted from the well at a rate upward of a million cubic feet daily on drill stem tests, the company said.

It said yesterday the well is bottomed at 11,000 feet and that oil horizons were also found at 3000 and 6000 feet.

Willamina Council Orders Pavement

Willamina—The city council has passed a resolution authorizing the paving of project No. 1, which includes B, C, and D streets from Water street to Fourth street; First street, Fourth street, Church street, and Gentry street on the north side of town; and Franklin, Baker, South Yamhill and Brown streets on the south side of town. The resolution calls for grading, curbs and storm sewers as well as paving.

The above named streets are the most important to the general welfare of the city, as they carry the business traffic and the school traffic.

A public hearing on the street improvement program will be held Jan. 11, at the grade school gymnasium, when citizens will have an opportunity to voice their opinions on the project.

The improvements will be made under the provisions of the Bancroft act, which makes the amount payable in 20 semi-annual installments over a period of 10 years.

The date of April, 1954, has been set in the resolution as the beginning of work on the project, with Nov. 1 as the date for the completion of the contracts.

Motorcyclist Dies Of Crash Injuries

Albany — Injuries suffered Monday by Alvin Albert Chapat, 18, when his motorcycle crashed into concrete steps of a residence on U. S. highway 20 two miles west of Albany, proved fatal at a Eugene hospital Wednesday.

The funeral will be held at St. Mary's church Saturday at 10 a.m., preceded by the recitation of the Rosary, also at the church Friday at 8 p.m. Arrangements are being made by the Fortmiller-Fredericksen Funeral home. The deceased was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Chapat of Albany and was born in Kansas coming to Oregon with his parents, living in Corvallis until six years ago when they moved to Albany. Besides his parents he is survived by two brothers, Melvin Lee and Calvin Francis, and grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. E. M. Marcotte, all of Albany. Burial will be in the Diverside cemetery.

Second Postman Makes Theft Bail

Lebanon—Donald W. Childs, Lebanon postal employe arrested last Saturday and charged with taking tuberculosis and health association funds from the mails, posted \$1000 bond Wednesday afternoon and is now free on bail.

Richard Durham, a postal employe at Sweet Home, arrested the same day on a similar charge posted bail previously.

The case will be heard in federal court in Portland with not date as yet set for the trial.

Ike's Letter Makes Denial

Seattle (AP) — A letter from President Eisenhower denying remarks concerning Republican power policies attributed to him by Sen. Magnuson (D-Wash.) has been released by Rep. Westland (R-Wash.).

The Everett Republican said he had the President's permission to disclose the contents of the letter about Magnuson's recent charge that the Republican administration will step out of the power project construction field once such dams as Chief Joseph and McNary are completed.

"As you well know," the President's letter said, "such an assertion most emphatically does not accurately represent my views. There is room in the power development field for both private agencies and the government."

He said the government's plan should "try to strike the proper balance between government and private resources. By government I do not mean only the federal government here in Washington; I mean, just as importantly, our state and local governments."

It is not correct, the President said, to say "that after completion of those projects now underway, this administration will abdicate its responsibility in the public power field."

More Revenue Seen For Willamina City

Willamina—Additional revenue for the city of Willamina is in prospect from Portland General Electric company under terms of a new franchise agreement now being considered by the city council.

The present agreement runs until 1956, but PGE has asked the city to consider canceling the present agreement and to consider an agreement whereby the company would pay a yearly fee amounting to 3 per cent of gross revenues from sales of electric energy to city customers. On the basis of the company's 1952 revenues the city would receive \$1446.58 for the year instead of the flat fee of \$520 received under the existing contract.

This proposal from PGE at this time comes as a result of the company's attempt to equalize fee payments and place them on the same basis with all cities in the PGE service.

Traffic Death Toll In Portland 53

Portland (AP) — Portland's traffic death toll for 1953 was raised to 53 today with deaths of two persons from injuries suffered in auto mishaps.

Nell Charles Evans, 66, was struck by a car about 7 p.m. yesterday and died shortly before midnight.

Deputy Coroner Ross Woodward said the death of Mrs. Louise Leveille, 73, also would be ruled a traffic fatality. She was struck by a car Dec. 5 and died a week ago in St. Vincent's hospital.
