

Jones Talks on Pool System

Increasing costs of higher education make it important for Oregon to take advantage of the new system under which Western states pool their graduate school resources, Dr. William C. Jones, Eugene, executive director of the Western Commission for Higher Education, said here Friday.

Dr. Jones spoke to 50 administrators of state and private colleges and public officials. Eight states now are in the program, under which the states open up their graduate schools to students from the other states. They are Arizona, New Mexico, Oregon, Idaho, Utah, Montana, Wyoming and Colorado.

"It is necessary," Jones said, "for each state to develop those graduate schools for which it possesses advantages, and to stay out of the fields in which other states have advantages."

Jones said the meeting was a "trial balloon," being the first of several meetings to be held in each state in the compact.

Other speakers included Chancellor Charles D. Byrne of the State System of Higher Education; Dean F. L. Gilfillan of Oregon State College; and State Sen. Dean H. Walker, Independence.

Oregon already is sending students to Colorado A. & M. college to study veterinary medicine.

Martin Luther Film Coming

The Capitol theater announced today that the widely heralded film, "Martin Luther," will start a limited engagement January 17 in Salem.

The Salem Ministerial association approved the showing at a recent meeting, and is urging all Salem residents to see the film. A committee under the general chairmanship of Rev. John L. Gamble of St. Mark's Lutheran church, is being formed to acquaint the residents of the Willamette valley of the playing time of the film at the theater.

The film depicts the later life and background of Martin Luther, and some of the causes that led to his famous act of nailing his 95 theses to the church door in Wittenburg. His teachings and writings led to the Reformation. The film is based on old Protestant and Catholic sources, and leans heavily on historic documents for its dialogue.

For its Salem engagement, all the Protestant churches, through the Salem Ministerial association, will play an active part in aiding the publicity and promotion of the film. Special discount tickets will be given to each church, so that members of the congregations can see the film at prices lower than regular box office prices established for the picture.

Fumes of Gas Cause Trouble

Carbon monoxide may be the cause of more traffic trouble than the few cases of asphyxiation that occur each winter, the State Traffic Safety Division said today.

Carbon monoxide in a closed car can sharply reduce a driver's alertness and co-ordination even though the concentration is not strong enough to cause unconsciousness or death, safety officials said. A driver so affected may not respond to an emergency situation quickly enough to avoid an accident.

Educators Told Of Co-Op Setup

Oregon is helping to pay the cost of an education in veterinary medicine at Colorado A. & M. under the program of the Western Interstate Program for Higher Education, about 50 leaders in education and government were told Friday afternoon at a conference on Oregon's part in the program, held on the Willamette campus.

Purpose of this compact, which is expected eventually to include all 11 western states, Hawaii and Alaska is to enable each state to develop certain fields in professional and scientific training, receiving students from other states and sending its own students to other states in fields their education develop.

Thus, Oregon has a medical and dental school, but no mining school or school for training veterinarians. Each state is expected to save money and all are expected to be able to have better programs.

Speakers included Senator Dean Walker, Chancellor Charles D. Fyrne, Dean F. A. Gilfillan of Oregon State, and Dr. William C. Jones, executive director for the entire organization with offices at Eugene. President G. Herbert Smith of Willamette university presided.
