American physicists, is dead.

The 85-year-old Nobel Prize winner succumbed Saturday at a rest home. He had been bedridden for infirmities of age for several provides. for several months.

His body will lie in state to-morrow at Forest Lawn Mem-orial park in nearby Glendale. private services are being planned for Wednesday. Dr. Millikan, an authority on cosmic rays, for years was head of the California Institute

of Technology here. He lived in nearby San Marino.

Winner of the Nobel Prize in physics in 1923, he held 25 honorary degrees from univer-sities and wrote 18 books and hundreds of pagers.
