

Hillsboro to Play Salem Here Tuesday in Return Match

Bob Wulf Is Leader In Scoring

The Salem high Vikings try for their fourth straight win of the season Tuesday night when the Vikings play the Hillsboro Spartans at Salem high. The Vikings defeated the Spartans December 8, 72-63 at Hillsboro after Salem had beaten Rosevelt of Portland in their first encounter.

Friday night Harold Hauk's squad opened their Big Six schedule with a 63-56 win over the Springfield Millers. Bob Wulf moved into the scoring leadership of the team with 20 points to boost his total to 38 points, three ahead of Jim Knapp with 35.

The Vikings apparently have overcome their lack of experienced height as the 6-4 Wulf has filled the center position quite well. Hauk will probably use Wulf at center, Knapp and Gordy Domogalla at the guards and Tom Pickens and Larry Springer or Wayne Ericksen at forwards.

In their first three games the Vikings have been more of a second quarter ball club as they have a total of 52 points for that period and 50 for the initial quarter. Friday it was a big third quarter spurt that gave Salem the win.

Other top scorers for the Vikings are Domogalla with 31, Pickens with 26, Springer with 21, and Wayne Ericksen and Herb Triplett with 11 apiece.

For Lee Gustafson's junior varsity Mary Strain is barely ahead with 22 points while Bob Tom has 21 and Don Zeh and Mary Strain follow closely with 19. Nick Error has 16 while two centers, Dale Jones and Stan Page each have 13 apiece.

The JV's have been a better third quarter offensive team and defensive squad. They have scored 58 points in three wins while their opposition was getting 25 for the third period.

High OSC Rating at Stake Against Indiana Tonight

Oregon State's rating as one of the nation's top basketball teams is at stake this week as Northern Division teams continue their tune up series preparatory to the opening of the Pacific Coast Conference season.

The Beavers, ranked No. 11 in the latest Associated Press poll, are booked for Monday-Tuesday meetings with top-rated Indiana, defending NCAA champion.

Beat Nebraska Easily
Easy winners over a strong Nebraska five in their fourth outing of the season Saturday night, the Beavers tackle the Moosiers on a twin bill that also will bring together Oregon and Nebraska.

The intersectional meetings are slated at Corvallis Monday night and at Eugene Tuesday night. A crowd of 10,000 or more is expected for each of the doubleheaders.

The Indiana-OSC clash will feature two of the game's most publicized players — The Beavers 7-foot-3 inch center Wade Swede Halbrook, and Indiana's All American, 6-foot-10 Don Schlundt.

Halbrook, who broke most Oregon scoring records as a high school player, has averaged 26.7 points in the four games he has played at OSC this season. He dropped in 29 points in the Beavers' 83-55 win over Nebraska Saturday night.

To Head for Ohio
Schlundt averaged 25.4 points a game as a sophomore at Indiana last season.

After the Indiana fracas, the Beavers will head east for Columbus, Ohio, and a scheduled game Saturday night with Ohio State. From there they will go to Raleigh, N. C. to play in the Dixie Classic next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

Oregon, Washington and Idaho will be on the road. Oregon plays UCLA at Los Angeles Saturday and Monday nights. Washington will compete in the Big tourney at Kansas City next weekend, and Idaho goes to Missouri for games next Monday and Tuesday nights with Montana.

The Washington State Cougars, who dropped three straight on last week's trip to California, will be idle until January 2 when they will be host to Eastern Washington College.
