Dallas Man's Book Will Please the Youngsters

When Charley Stovall, Dallas, outdoor fellow and logger, wrote his recent, slim volume, "Hi, Everyone," portraying the lives and habits of 22 wild animals in their native habit, he created a worthwhile book for the children and one from which their parents may also profit.

Illustrations used and presented in a sepia tone represent fine photographs obtained from the U. S. Fish and Wild Life Service. Stovall has presented his brief text dedicated to each of the creatures in verse and in an easy to read and remember meter. For instance, he has this to say in one of five verses about the Canada Honkers:

"A mamma honk and a papa honk
Are swimming on a lake.
And several little baby honks
Are swimming in their wake."

Only a lilting tune is lacking to carry many such measures as this one in to a charming nursery song.

Pageant Press, 130 W. 42nd St., New York City, publishes Stovall's \$5-page volume attractively bound and inclosed in a jacket illustrated by a baby fox.

Strike Ends Paris Flights

Paris (AP) — A French airport strike stopped all U. S. military transport flights in and out of Paris Monday and cut into Christmas holiday plans for many American soldiers in Europe. American servicemen stationed in France who were planning on spending their holidays in other European countries were stranded at the Military Air Transport Service terminal. Some of them tried to get reservations on already overcrowded trains.

The strike of 2,000 control tower, radio and radar operators for pay increases forced both Pan American and Trans World Airlines to divert their planes to Brussels.

Chicago (AP) — A family of seven was wiped out by an automobile-train collision at a Soo Line crossing near suburban Wheeling last night.

Killed in the crash were Fred Galle, 37-year-old Cary, Ill., laborer; his wife, Violet, 33; and their children, Evelyn 10, John 8, Elaine 6, and Carol Ann 1.

A 2-year-old daughter, Audrey, died several hours later of injuries, including a skull fracture.

Man Rescued After Long Ordeal

St. Petersburg, Fla. (AP) — A Michigan man, rescued after clinging to the pontoons of his light plane for 36 hours in the Gulf of Mexico, was recovering here Monday.

Roy K. Carlson, 47, of Whitmore Lake, Mich., was treated for exposure, cuts and bruises.

A tug picked him up 60 miles west of Tarpon Springs, Sunday.

Carlson was flying from Livonia, Mich., to Lake Park, Fla., when his Piper Cub developed engine trouble Friday afternoon. He was forced to alight in the gulf about a fourth of a mile off shore.

Final Services for Spokane Editor

Spokane (AP) — Funeral services were scheduled here Monday for Malcolm C. Glendinning, retired managing editor of the Spokesman-Review.

Glendinning, 78, died Saturday after a lengthy illness.

A newspaperman for nearly half a century, Glendinning went to work on the Spokesman-Review as a reporter in 1902. In 1909, he became publisher of the Wallace, Idaho, Press but returned to the Spokesman-Review the following year and remaining there until his retirement in 1950.

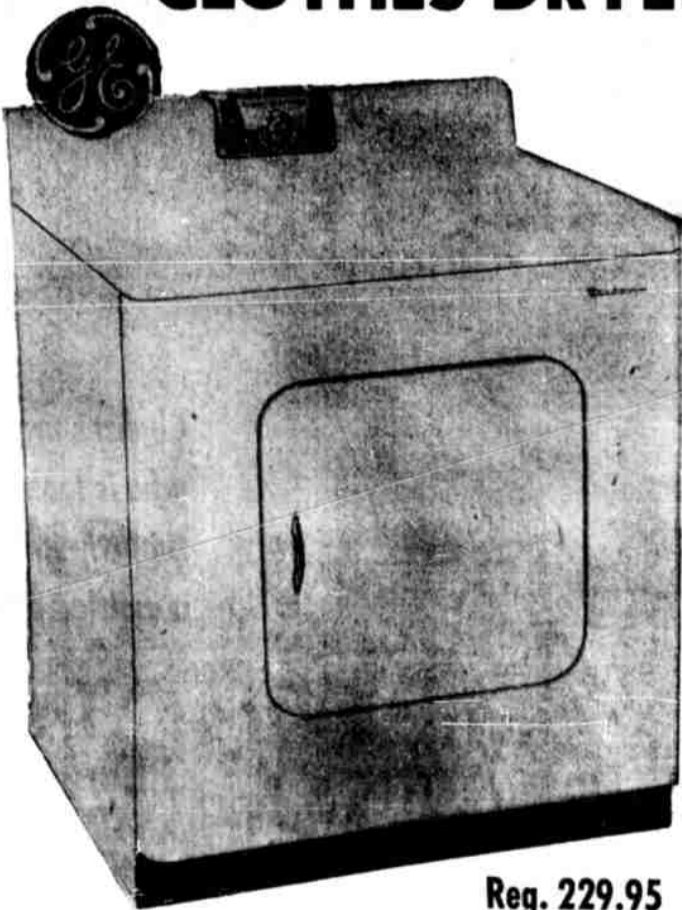
