**Eggs a la Bonne Femme**  
Ingredients: For each serving—5 teaspoons butter or margarine, 1/2 cup lightly packed thin strips onion (1 medium-small onion), 1 teaspoon wine vinegar, 2 eggs, salt and pepper, 1/4 cup lightly packed tiny bread cubes (made from French bread or rolls with crusts left on).

Method: Melt 2 teaspoons butter in skillet; add onion and cook over low heat 5 to 7 minutes, until onion is still somewhat crisp but not brown. Add wine vinegar to skillet; turn in to individual 6-inch heat-resistant glass pie plate. Break eggs over onions; sprinkle eggs with salt and pepper. Melt 3 teaspoons butter in skillet; add bread cubes and stir well. Sprinkle bread cubes over eggs, covering yolks. Bake in slow (325 F) oven 17 minutes. Serve at once.
