Frequent reports of clashes between Indian and Red Chinese troops come from the poorly defined northern frontier areas, which just as frequently are officially denied

The reports have increased in volume since 1950 when the Reds moved into Tibet with its 1300-mile common border with India.

Other Rumors Also disquieting have been reports that in western Tibet Russian air bases are being built only about 300 miles from the Indian capital of New Delhi, and that the high Himalayaas no longer offer any assurance against inva-
