

New York (A)—A tobacco industry research committee has been fromed by cigarette manufacturers and tobacco groups to conduct research on "the theory that cigarette smoking is in some way linked with lung cancer."

An advertisement appearing today in many major newspapers of the nation says the manufacturers believe "the products we make are not injurious to health."

The display advertisement adds, however, that medical research should not be dismissed lightly "even though its results are inconclusive."

Formation of the committee, which includes all but one major American cigarette manufacturer and several associations of tobacco growers, was announced yes-terday. Others may join the com-mittee ltaer, a spokesman said.
