

Russian Mig 15 On Way to U.S.

Tokyo (AP)—A C124 Globemaster left Okinawa for the United States today with a cargo that included the Russian-made MIG-15 which a North Korean pilot surrendered to the United States last September.

The Globemaster took off from Okinawa with the disassembled, crated MIG only a few hours after the U. S. government publicly withdrew its offer to return the plane to its rightful owner.

"No one seems willing to take credit for being owner of the plane or to come forward and claim it," Gen. John E. Hull's Far East command said.

The offer to return the plane had been drawn up in Washington in a move to make the communists admit Russia gave the North Koreans and Chinese war equipment.

The MIG, which underwent flight tests on Okinawa, will be reassembled and given further tests at Wright-Patterson Field, Dayton, Ohio, the Air Force said.
