## Sanitary Law For Woodburn

**WOODBURN** — An ordinance was introduced at the Woodburn City Council meeting this week making it mandatory for owners of premises or buildings within 100 feet of a Woodburn city sewer to connect with the municipal sewer systems before Sept. 1, 1954.

It also will affect sewer systems constructed after that date. The ordinance passed through the first and second readings. The third reading and final passage of the ordinance is scheduled for the next council meeting, Jan. 26.

Connection with the sewer system would be made at the expense of the property owners and only a licensed plumber or member of the street department would make the connection.

Anyone could lay the tile from the building to the sewer and bypass the septic tank but all such work would have to be inspected by a licensed plumber or an inspector designated by the council. A signed statement would have to be filed with the city recorder and a \$1 inspection fee paid if the services of a city inspector were used.

The ordinance provides that the city may abate the nuisance of the use of outhouses, cess pools and septic tanks if the property owner does not comply within 30 days after written notice by the city. The cost to the city of labor, material, serving notice and 10 per cent administration fee for abating the nuisance will be assessed to the property owner.

Violation of any provision of the ordinance would make the property owner subject to a fine of from \$5 to \$50 or imprisonment for not more than 10 days, or both. The proposed ordinance would also repeal ordinance 943 permitting voluntary connection to the sewer.

An ordinance was adopted providing for the assessment cost of the improvement of High Street to the properties benefited. Reports were made on the proposal that the city operate an ambulance but no decision was made pending investigation. The council adjourned to meet Wednesday night when 12 bids were opened for the construction of sewers in the Northwest sewage collection district. Decision will be made within 10 days.

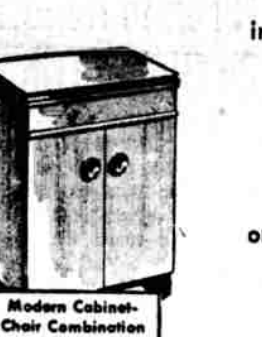
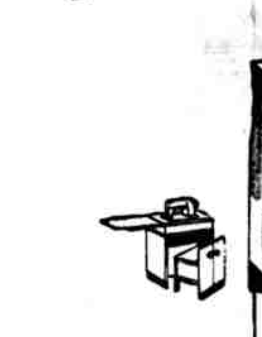
