Roosevelt Gets Even For Defeat

Roosevelt's Roughriders came from behind in the final minutes to edge the Salem high Vikings 45-42 at Portland last night. Roosevelt tied it up with 3 1/2 minutes left and Dennis Rodin dropped in a free throw to put the Teddies out in front.

Dave Wanaka's field goal with 3 1/2 left put the Teddies even with Salem and then Rodin's free throw made it 40-39. Roosevelt came back with two free throws to make it 42-41. The clubs exchanged free throws and it was 43-42 with 15 seconds left. The Teddies ended the game with two free throws.

Vikings Led Most of the Way The Portland school took an early 4-0 lead on four points by Rodin but Gordy Domogalla sank two field goals. Jim Knapp hit for one field goal, and Larry Springer had a free throw to give Salem a 7-4 lead, which they didn't give up until the final minutes of the game.

Domogalla continued to pace the Vikings as Harold Hauk's stab went on to hold a 15-10 first quarter lead with Domogalla having eight of the points. Jim Knapp had four points in the initial quarter.

The two teams played an even terms in the second quarter with both getting 14 points to give Salem a 29-24 halftime lead. Rodin once again led the Teddies as the senior forward made eight points.

A slow third quarter saw Salem sink only one field goal and six free shots while Roosevelt had two field goals and three charity tosses. Salem's one point edge extended their lead to 37-31. Nine Straight Points

The Vikings and the Teddies exchanged field goals in the opening moments of the final period as Jim Knapp hit for Salem and Bill Witalia hit for the Roughriders. Salem then went downhill as the Teddies made nine straight points and Salem none.

Roosevelt's Wanaka took high scoring honors for the game with six field goals and six free throws for 18 points. His teammate Rodin had 16 on three field goals and 10 free throws.

For the losing Vikings Knapp had 16 points on five field goals and six free shots. Gordy Domogalla was next with 13 markers. Both clubs had 13 field goals but the Roughriders had 19 free throws to 1 for the Vikings. Salem defeated them 50-46 earlier in the season.

Lee Gustafson's Salem high junior varsity trounced the Roosevelt JV's 71-41 for their sixth straight win. Salem led all the way with a 21-8 first quarter lead, a 34-18 halftime lead, and a 51-29 third quarter lead.

Forward Don Zeh led the Viking JV's with 15 points while Harry Santen, reserve center had 11, and Don Piggly and Dale Jones each had 10. Center Murray had 10 for the Roosevelt JV's.

Salem travels to Corvallis Tuesday for a tough Big Six game with the powerful Corvallis Spartans. Corvallis is led by 6-7 center Dave Gambee, one of the leading scorers in the state.
