Albany Coach Gets Promotion

ALBANY — Appointment of Stanley Czech, Albany union high school vice principal and head football coach, as full-time assistant principal was announced Friday by John Cox, union high school district No. 8 superintendent.

Superintendent Cox said that the appointment was approved by the district board of directors at its December meeting, subject to Czech's acceptance.

This means, said the superintendent, that it will be necessary for the coach to employ a new football coach.

Necessity for a full-time school administrator at the union high school, superintendent Cox explained, arises from the fact that when the senior high school and ninth grade are combined as a four-year high school in the new building now in process of construction, the student body will number not less than 1050.

Czech came to Albany in 1948 following his graduation from Oregon State college as line coach under former Coach Rex Husaker, and succeeded Husaker when the latter went to Klamath Falls to coach at the Oregon Institute of Technology.

Lebanon Sewage Plant Now 70 Percent Complete

LEBANON—The city sewage disposal plant is 70 percent complete, Mayor Elmer Fitzgerald reported at the city council meeting this week. It may be in operation before July 1, the original date set for completion.

The announcement was made in the mayor's review of civic accomplishments during 1953. The 70 percent completion mark included both primary treatment plant and a second contract for construction of a secondary filter unit.

The mayor stressed the police department's safety program which has resulted in three straight years without a traffic fatality within the city.

He pointed out that mercury vapor street lights have replaced the old type in nearly all sections of the city. The program will be completed this year, he said.

The current population survey, taken monthly here and in 229 other areas throughout the country, provides up-to-date national figures on employment and unemployment. This information is used by business and government for analysis of current labor force conditions.

Supervisor Rainboth pointed out that information furnished to the Census Bureau concerning individual persons is accorded confidential treatment under the law and only statistical totals are published. Interviews for the current population survey in this area are handled by Opal L. Nieswander and Robert H. Treupel.
