

### Red Threat May Result in War

SEOUL (AP) — Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, 8th army commander, said Saturday that if the communists attempt to halt the release of anti-Red war prisoners Jan. 23 it would "most likely start the Korean war over again."

The Reds have not threatened force, but Taylor warned in a news conference the 8th army will be alerted for any contingency.

He said his troops are fully prepared for "orderly or emergency situations" that may arise from the release of 22,500 anti-Red North Korean and Chinese POWs in compounds in the neutral zone near Panmunjom.

### Chief Justice To Broadcast

WASHINGTON (AP) — A speech by Chief Justice Earl Warren Thursday evening will be carried nationally by all four major radio networks, Columbia university announced today.

Warren will be the principal speaker at the Columbia university bi-centennial Alexander Hamilton dinner, which is sponsored by Columbia alumni.

The address will be Warren's first major speech since his appointment to the high tribunal.

Columbia said he would speak about 25 minutes, starting at about 10:35 p.m. EST.

### Six Tree Farms Certified in State

PORTLAND (AP) — Thirteen tree farms, totalling 10,440 privately owned acres, have been certified by the Industrial Forestry Assn.

This, plus the addition of 5,717 acres to existing farms, raises the total number of tree farms in the Douglas fir region to 203, with a total of 4,266,833 acres, Ray F. Morse, Longview, chairman of the association's board of directors, reported.

Six of the new tree farms are in Oregon, raising the state's total to 74 with 1,655,228 acres. Washington has 129 farms with 2,601,405 acres.

Schimberg said that if he is elected, one of his first projects will be that of equalizing the land values in the city of Salem, which he considered to be considerably out of line in many instances. He added that he is in favor of the revaluation program worked out by the state tax department and the county court during a conference of some time ago.

Schimberg has been working on the revaluation of improvements during the past two years. The candidate for the assessor's post came to Salem from Rochester, Minn., as an employee of the National Cash Register company. He is 53 years of age, a member of Capital Post No. 9, American Legion, 40 et 8, Salem Elks and is secretary of the East Salem Lions club.

In filing for the office, Schimberg states he has done so with the full understanding that Cliff Lewis, recently appointed assessor, will not be a candidate for the office in the spring primary.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — A \$25,000 fine has been slapped on RKO studio by the movie code administrator for exhibiting and advertising Jane Russell's latest picture "French Line," without the Production Code Administration's seal of approval.

The movie has been banned by the Catholic Church's Legion of Decency and by the St. Louis Catholic archdiocese. It was given its premiere in St. Louis 1 a t month.

Production Code Administrator Joseph Breen termed the film "offensive because of indecent exposure" during a dance number by Miss Russell. She agreed with the critic and refused to go to St. Louis for the premiere.

VIENNA (AP) — Oscar Straus, famed Viennese-born composer of "The Chocolate Soldier," and more than 50 other operettas, died of heart disease Monday in Bad Ischl. He was 83.

Though he won fame in the same field, he was no relation to Vienna's waltz king, Johann Straus. Straus fled his native Austria at the 1938 Anschluss and lived in Paris. In 1940, he fled the Nazi


evening at 8 o'clock in the school library.
