## Adults May Learn to Read

Adults who for one reason or another failed to learn to read during their adolescence, will continue to have the opportunity to improve their mental status through the medium of a course in connection with the adult education program. The matter came up for consideration during Tuesday night's meeting of the board of directors. Currently the class has a membership of only four adults with the possibility of a fifth coming in. Since it takes eight "pupils" to make the course self-sustaining, it was a question of discontinuing or carrying on. The directors felt that the district could well afford to finance the project at a cost of \$45 per term, since it is possible this amount might be lessened. The participants each pay \$5 tuition per term.

## Sub-Committee to Chart Power Course
