New Orders on Perfidy Charge

WASHINGTON (AP) — The State Department said Wednesday it has sent new instructions to Panmunjom on whether the United States should insist on a retraction of Red China's charge of "perfidy." Special ambassador Arthur H. Dean walked out of preliminary talks on a Korea peace conference last Dec. 12 in protest against the Communist accusation. He said then he would not return until the Communist took back the charge. However, new talks have been scheduled to set a date for reopening these broken-off preliminaries. Kenneth Young, Dean's aide, arranged these talks between liaison officers. Snydam said Young had been notified "in a message sent during the last 24 hours."

Sheridan Dates New Sewer Vote

SHERIDAN — Sheridan will vote Jan. 22 for the third time, on a municipal sewer system and disposal plant. Under the proposal which will be voted on, water users will pay a sewer rental rate of \$2.25 a month for 500 cubic feet of water. Consumers using more than 500 cubic feet will pay 20 cents per 100 feet above the flat charge. Large consumers will pay 10 cents per 100 cubic feet over the 500 mark. During the summer months, the consumers will pay the eight-month average from September to June. Under the last plan the voters rejected, the consumers would have paid a flat \$3 per month charge, plus an ad valorem tax, estimated at approximately five mills. The charge of five mills is estimated for the new financing plan, in addition to the water users charge and the 75¢ hook-up charge. To finance the \$350,000 bond issue and operate the system for 25 years, about \$30,000 is needed each year. The users charge will raise about \$24,300 and the balance would come from the ad valorem tax.

Nimitz Gives Trophy To Portland Reserves

PORTLAND (AP) — Fleet Adm. Chester Nimitz presented the Nimitz Trophy to Portland's reserve submarine division 13-7 before a crowd of 2,200 here Tuesday night. The trophy is awarded annually by the Navy Department to the outstanding U. S. naval reserve submarine division. Nimitz praised members of all naval reserve divisions, declaring: "We are a maritime nation and our future depends on our sea power and the ability to immediately seize control of the seas. Without the reserves this would not be possible."

Strive to Make REA Political

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — A Republican congressman Wednesday denounced what he called determined efforts to make a political football out of the Rural Electrification Administration program.

In an address at the annual convention of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Assn. Rep. Lovre (R-SD) said:

"Individuals and groups, with authority to speak for neither of the major political parties, have tried to make it appear that the present administration was talking with tongue in cheek when it drafted a party platform that pledged its continued support for rural electrification.

"The REA program, these self-appointed spokesmen have said, is being scuttled. The farmers, they have said, are being sold down the river.

"What are the facts? The simple, straight-forward fact is that during the past 13 months, under the present administration, the REA program has been strengthened and improved and carried forward with fresh vigor and renewed determination."
