Fish Filets Mashed Potatoes  
Carrots Savory Cole Slaw  
Bread and Butter  
Fruit Gelatin Beverage  
Savory Cole Slaw  
Ingredients: 1/2 cup undiluted evaporated milk, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 1/4 cup cider vinegar, 1 cups finely cut green cabbage.

Method: Mix evaporated milk, sugar, salt and pepper and let stand about 5 minutes to dissolve sugar. Gradually stir in vinegar. Chill. (Makes about 3/4 cup dressing.) For salad mix 1/2 cup of dressing with cabbage, chill until ready to serve. Makes 4 to 6 servings.
