Your 1953 Income Tax

How to File Your 1953 Return

Who Must File
Every citizen or resident of the United States—whether an adult or minor—who had \$600 or more gross income in 1953 must file an income tax return on Form 1040 or 1040-A.

When to File
Most of your tax is withheld from your wages every payday or paid on Declarations of Estimated Tax every quarter. However, the law requires you to file an annual return to determine whether you owe more or you should get a refund.

When to File
Between January 1 and March 15, 1954. Try to avoid the last-minute rush. Those few individuals who keep books on a fiscal year basis must file by the 15th day of the third month after the close of their years.
