

Willamette Bearcats in First Road Test at Linfield Tonight

Bearcats Try to Hold Loop Lead

Coach John Lewis considers tonight's Willamette university game at Linfield a more decisive test of how his Bearcats will react to conference games on the road.

At home Willamette has felt comfortable, taking a quick 3-0 lead in the circuit by edging Whitman twice and trampling College of Idaho. There remain, however, eight games away among the 12 remaining and it is well known how rude home teams are to visitors.

Linfield, for example, split with Portland State and with Oregon College of Education and otherwise have proved red-hot and lukewarm at various times. Always there are at least three threats to the lead in the conference.

Pete Reed leads Willamette scorers in the first 13 games, with 173 points. Dick Hoy is next with 160 and Tom Gooding third with 160.

"We've come a ways in the last two weeks," Lewis said, and will have to keep improving to stay near the front.

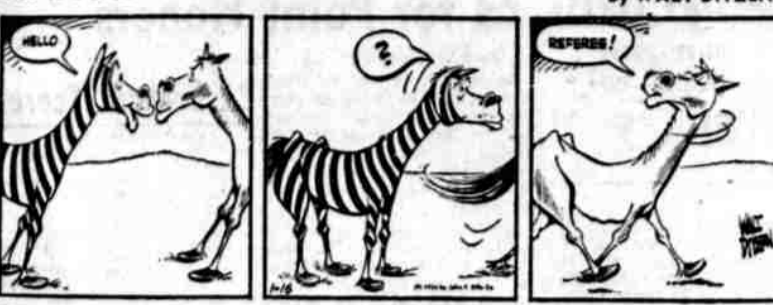
