Should the deal be made the city has tentatively in mind the transfer of the water department affice from the present small building on Trade Street to the Capital Journal building, and the transfer to that building of the police department from City Hall, including the jail, for which there is ample space in the base-ment.

there is ample space in the base-ment. This would release for other purposes all the space now occu-pied by the police department on the first floor of City Hall, and some of it probably would be used for storage and vault in-stallation. City Hall is now short of storage space. Also tentatively in mind is con-struction of a new building on property owned by the water de-partment in the city shop area on 20th Street south of Mission. This would be moved the water depart-ment's laboratories and other ac-tivities of that department aside from office operation. Mainwaring has offered the city a five month lease and option on the property in order to give it time to complete arrangements for the purchase, without obliga-tion to the city except to pay in-terest, property tax and fire in-surance on the property during the period. The city has the right to terminate it at any time if it decides not to buy.

Snowfall Lighter To East and South




