Ingredients: ¼ cup butter or
margarine, ¼ cup flour, 1 cup
chicken stock, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, ¼ teaspoon pepper, 3
cups diced cooked chicken, 1 cup
cooked diced carrots, 8 cooked
small white onloss, 1 tablespoon
minced parsley, 1 cup sifted flour,
1 teaspoon baking powder, ¼ teaspoon salt, 1¼ cups mashed cooked yams or one No. 2 can (drained
and mashed) yams, ½ cup shortening (melted), 1 egg (well beaten)

ening (metted), I egg (well beaten).

Method: Melt butter in saucepan
over low heat; blend in ¼ cup
flour. Add chicken, stock and
milk and cook and stir until thickened. Stir in 1 teaspoon salt, pepper, chicken, carrots, onions and
parsley. Turn into greased 1½
quart casserole. Sift I cup flour,
baking powder and ½ teaspoon
salt together. Add yams, melted
shortening and egg: mix until
blended. Turn out on lightly floured board and roll out to ¼-inch
thickness. Top chicken mixture
with yam dough and flute edges,
sealing to sides of casserole. Bake
in moderate (350F) oven, 40 minutes. Makes 6 servings.
