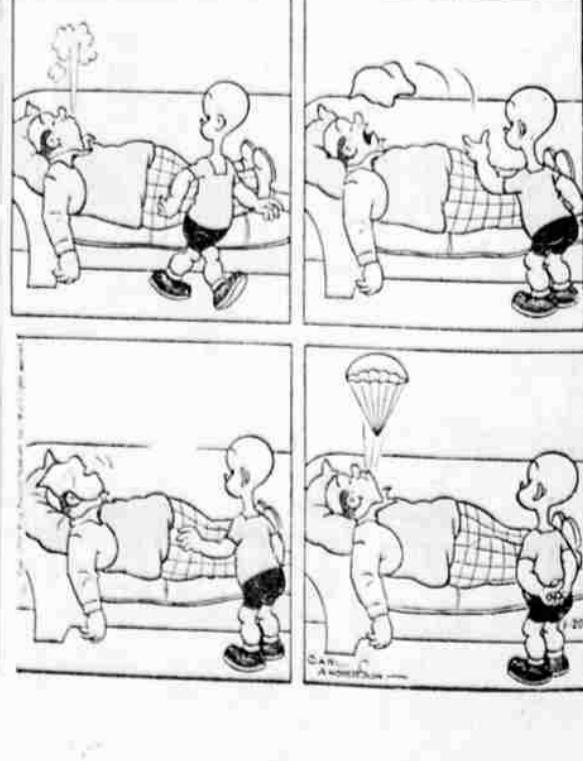
Recess Called on Price-Fixing Case

SEATTLE (AP)—A Federal Trade Commission examiner Monday called a two-day recess in a hearing on price-fixing charges against the Alaska Salmon Industry and fishermen's unions to give the principals a chance to negotiate a settlement among themselves.

Examiner Everett F. Haycraft said the hearing will be resumed Wednesday at 10 a.m.

Forty-three companies and 11 fishermen's unions have been charged with conspiring to fix prices for salmon. The charge stems from a longtime practice of canners and the unions of negotiating prices to be paid for fish. But canners and unions have denied there is anything illegal about the procedure.
