

Soldat Finishes Ross on 'Wolf Leap' to Neck

Hall of Fame Vote Due

NEW YORK (AP)—Baseball's Hall of Fame, now numbering 70 members, is expected to be increased by two and perhaps as many as five today when the ballots are counted in the 14th annual election.

And under a new rule, in effect for the first time this year, a player must have been out of organized ball at least five years. The only exception is those who received more than 100 votes last year when Dizzy Dean and Al Simmons were named. Joe DiMaggio, the New York Yankee Clipper; Bill Dickey, former catcher and now coach with the Yankees; and Ted Lyons, ex-Chicago White Sox

pitcher and manager and recently signed as Brooklyn coach.

Walter (Rabbit) Maraville, the great little shortstop who died recently, appears to be the outstanding candidate. Last year he received 174 votes, 24 short of election.

Maraville, sparkling of the 1914 Boston Braves world champion team, had been away from organized ball for more than a decade.

Bill Terry, one of the all-time New York Giant greats and former manager, also is considered a strong candidate.
