Good to low prime steers sold steady to 50 cents lower while average prime to high prime types, as well as utility and commercial grades, held steady. High choice and prime steers brought 25.50 to \$31.00, the top.

The upturn brought out a substantial increase in offerings of cash corn by the country, bookings being placed at 180,000 bushels.
